

Central Wisconsin Christian Board Highlights for December

1. The Advancement Committee is involved in planning a series of enrollment-related promotional events, highlighted by a 4K-12 Open House on Saturday, January 30th. We will be cross-promoting with Randolph Christian to zip codes in a 30-mile radius.
2. The Advancement Committee has kicked off the Sharing the Promise annual campaign with a goal of \$90,000 for the 2009-2010 school year.
3. The Board reviewed a Staff/Board Reflection Survey which was taken at the in-service in November.
4. Education Committee continues to examine the curriculum formulating a list of key components that comprise the Christ-centered education at CWC.
5. Staff assignments and schedules for the second semester were finalized.
6. The financials continue to look very strong for the current fiscal year. Finance Committee reviewed the procedure for tuition collection and the process for dealing with past-due tuition accounts.
7. John Theune, Scott De Young, and Ben Westra have accepted appointments to the Foundation Board.
8. The Board received with gratitude the donation of a parcel of land at 811 W. Main St in Waupun. This is the lot directly to the south of Bargains Galore. Future discussion will lead to the use of this property.
9. CWC has received the Hicks' Foundation Technology Grant for \$5000. The grant money will be used in June to install SMART boards in the first and third grade rooms and update technology in several other areas.
10. A year end gift of \$20,000 has been designated to the classrooms to aid teachers in the education of their students. This gift has purchased classroom aids, book shelving, technology, marker boards, audio visuals, transportation, and music equipment not provided for in our budget. The CWC board is grateful for the generosity shown by the society over the last several months.

In the past month CWC students, staff and society have raised funds, provided meals, and given gifts for local families with needs, the Waupun food pantry, World Vision causes in Africa, and for American troops overseas. **These small gestures demonstrate just a portion of our gratitude to the Giver of all good things for our salvation in Christ Jesus. In this Christmas season, may all of our families celebrate the presence of the Christ child, our Savior, in our homes and the world!**
